

# CIS 3270 Fall 2006 Project Demonstration FAQ

## When and who?

Project demonstrations will be on 12/4 and 12/6. Below is the demonstration order.

1. 12/4: Danylo Matveyenko, Robert Seaman, Andrew/Andre Fraser
2. 12/6: Ringham/Puckett, Andrew Wade, Raheel Ishtiag, Mathew Werner

## What is the purpose of demonstration?

- To demo you have completed all functionalities listed in your project proposal, and have completed well.
- To gain 60% of the credits of your project grading.
- To win a best-project prize, and to get some feedback from the class (and me), so you may still improve it in future.

## Do I have to be present?

Everyone must be present in both sessions, including those who did not choose the project option. Your class participation will be penalized if absent.

## What to demo?

Each person/group will have 25 minutes to demo the system (we will have more time on 12/6). You need to demo:

- General description of your project, background, etc.
- All proposed functionalities with example usage.
- (optional) Additional and unique features you have developed.
- (optional) The source code of functionalities which have unique and creative design
- (optional) Where you are not satisfied, have difficulty with, or are seeking better solutions
- (optional) Any other things that audience will ask to see.

## Is there a prize for the winner?

The best project will be awarded a small prize. The prize will be awarded after all demos and evaluations.

## How to choose the winner?

Each student will fill a demo evaluation form (evaluation forms will be distributed in class). You will evaluate every project on a 10 point scale. At the end of all demos, you will nominate 2 projects as the best-project candidates. Then the project with the most nominations is the winning one.
